Once an activity is determined to be accomplished or has become an established practice, it is moved to the appendix section of the Strategic Action Plan. When an objective or activity is first added, it is indicated as **New**. Activities that have been implemented and are continuing are indicated as **Continue**. Those that have been initiated but are not fully implemented are indicated **In Progress**. Activities that may not have been addressed recently and/or require more emphasis are listed as **Renewed** and those that are continuing but have been changed in any way, are indicated as **Revised**.
